Re: Easter Conference

I am delighted to write to you about a comprehensive Easter revision conference for our Year 11 students. This year we will be running subjects from Tuesday 3 April through to Friday 13 April. The full timetable can be found with this letter and also on our academies website. Students are invited to attend the subjects that are relevant to them, with core subjects running primarily in week one and foundation subjects in week two. We do appreciate some subjects run at the same time, due to the availability of staff, and students can make a decision as to which session would be of the most benefit. It is certainly not expected that students attend everything every day and sessions are timed to allow students autonomy and independence around their revision – with no day ending later than 2.30pm. We fully appreciate that there will be family commitments and holidays in place, and not everyone will be able to attend everything. All students received revision folders at the last parent evening and will have a wealth of revision materials to be using over this period.

The conferences will run at some slightly different times each day, as indicated on the timetable. Students attending will need to enter at the student site reception and *must* sign in whilst on site. As it is the holiday, please be aware there will be no canteen provision, so students will need to bring packed lunches and drinks if they are staying for the day and they should wear mufti. The academies will not be open for students to come in who are not part of a session and students should only attend the designated subject areas at the designated times. This is for health and safety reasons and any student arriving who is not part of an organised session will be asked to leave. There will be work carried out on site by contractors during the holidays and no staff supervision, so it is not safe to do so. I would request that students arrive promptly to the timed sessions and stay for the duration. Colleagues have made a commitment to running the sessions, which have proved hugely beneficial over previous years, and we trust students will use them as an appropriate way to revise regularly for their imminent examinations.
